HOW DOES SCHOLARSHIP WORK?

- Specific Gita Shlokas will be given to participants as per age group
- They are required to memorize Shlokas and understand the meaning
- There will be a Video conference/interview with short listed candidates on diction and meaning of Shlokas
- Winners will be announced via email / website

□Fill out and submit scholarship application available on <u>hinduscholarship.org</u>
□One paragraph summary of your community service work from the current academic year.
□A transcript (official or unofficial) or report card
□A recorded audio of your shloka recitation in mp3 format (memorize and recite from memory) - <u>download</u>
<u>Gita Shlokas using link below</u>
□Write the meaning of 'each individual' shloka separately and relate it to your own personal experience. If you are unable to relate the meaning to your personal life, you can ask someone else and use their example. It must be a real-life example.
□Submission deadline is <u>15th August 2017.</u>
